

## STATE (PRESIDENTIAL) ELECTION NOVEMBER 8, 2016

The voter registration deadline for the November 8<sup>th</sup> State Election is 8:00PM on Wednesday October 19<sup>th</sup>. To check to see if you are registered to vote, and to find information on how to register to vote, you may visit the Secretary of the Commonwealth's website: [www.sec.state.ma.us/ele](http://www.sec.state.ma.us/ele). If you need to register to vote, you may do it online by visiting: [www.RegisterToVoteMA.com](http://www.RegisterToVoteMA.com). All you need is a license or an I.D. issued by the Registry of Motor Vehicles to apply online. To be eligible to vote in the November 8<sup>th</sup> State Election, you must register to vote or make any necessary changes to your voter registration by October 19<sup>th</sup>, 2016. The Town Clerk's Office will be open until 8:00PM on October 19<sup>th</sup> for voter registration. You may also register to vote by mail, but the mail in application must be post marked by October 19<sup>th</sup> to be eligible to vote in the November 8<sup>th</sup> election. ### EARLY VOTING FOR NOVEMBER 8<sup>TH</sup> ELECTION

We are pleased to announce that Early Voting will be available to all registered voters for the November 8<sup>th</sup> Election. Unlike absentee voting, early voting is for every registered voter. Registered voters do not need an excuse or reason to vote early. Early voting can be done in person or by mail. Registered voters have the option to request an early voting ballot through the mail. Simply fill out an application and mail it to the Town Clerk's Office, 36 Bartlet Street, Andover, MA 01810. Early Voting sessions for in person voting will be held at the Town Office Building, 36 Bartlet Street on the following dates and times:
