We're studying three dams in Andover, examining options to restore native fish and wildlife by re-establishing a natural, free-flowing river ecosystem. Options under consideration include removing or modifying the dams: Balmoral, Marland Place and Ballardvale Dams.

The group recently completed a major engineering study, and is hosting this meeting to share the results of our progress to date, and seek **your** thoughts on the river and its restoration!
